LOVE Program

I hope your children have been coming home each week and sharing with you what they have learnt during their Peer Support - LOVE program lessons. Visiting the classrooms during these lessons has been very insightful. It has been wonderful to see all our students Kindergarten to Year 6 interacting with each other in such a positive and collaborative way. Our older students are a credit to themselves as they have really excelled in helping the younger students in their group.

Throughout this term the students will be involved in a weekly lesson, with a focus, relating directly to the school's matrix of behaviour expectations - establishing expectations to: **Love Respectfully, Live Safely, Learn Daily.**Teacher's will then revise and apply this focus with their class throughout the week. Covered so far:

- We influence others to be like Jesus so that we can live out Jesus' 'Golden Rule' in our school. When we 'do to others what you want them to do to you' we are living Jesus' Golden Rule.

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
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Attendance




26th of August. The topic we will be presenting is on Building Young People to Face Modern Day Challenges
