
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Why is my Child's Teacher out of Class?

Like professionals in other fields, all teachers are required to keep up to date with current thinking on best practices and new developments in all curriculum areas. From time to time teachers are required to attend professional development opportunities to learn about changes to curriculum, new methods of teaching & learning and other ways of integrating technology. These sessions sometimes occur during the day, after school or in the school holidays. Teachers are also given time during the year to conduct assessments to pinpoint your child's learning needs. Some teachers also have additional responsibilities which benefit the whole school. At times, teachers are also required at Diocesan events, etc. Teachers also have entitlements such as sick leave, long service leave, maternity leave, bereavement leave, jury duty, etc. Consequently, there will be times when your child's teacher is absent from the classroom. On these days the teacher's program and day book is followed. Teachers on a grade work closely together allowing the grade partners to liaise with the Casual teacher so that good teaching and learning continue and routines are kept. We thank you for your support in this area.

Attendance ~ Every Learner Every Day



We have dropped down a further 0.10% in student absences from the previous fortnight. Can we improve this during the last two weeks of term? I believe this is achievable but I need all of our parents support to make this possible. Who will take up this challenge?

Another issue that we are experiencing with the high number of absences is that many parents send their children back to school but do not send in a note giving a reason why the child was away. We have currently 584 Unexplained **Absences**. It is a legal requirement that parents provide a reason for student absences. The families that this relates to will receive a yellow note next week with all relevant dates. Please complete, sign and return back to school asap.

Arriving Late to School

Just a reminder to all parents that children who are late to school in the morning are asked to drop in at the office accompanied by a parent or adult to collect a partial absence pass. This is a Parramatta Diocesan Education protocol that needs to be adhered to. If a student who is late is accompanied by an adult to the office the partial absence is recorded as "explained". If a student presents themselves at the office without an accompanying parent or adult, it is recorded on their attendance record as an "unexplained" partial absence. Irrespective of whether or not a child is accompanied by an adult on being late to school, they are to drop into the office before proceeding to class. If they don't, their teacher would have already marked them as absent for the day as office staff not classroom teachers, are responsible for recording late comers to school. Your assistance in this matter will be greatly appreciated and will avoid inaccuracies pertaining to your child's attendance records in the future.



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Moving schools

If your child/children is changing schools and will no longer be attending Holy Family, Catholic Education Diocese Parramatta requires 10 weeks written notice. In this notice you are required to indicate the school your child will be attending.

Lost Property and Hats

Our lost property table, located at the stairs just past the office, is currently overrun with items. At the end of this term any unclaimed property will be donated to St Vincent's De Paul. Please label all students property and ask them to have a look in this area for anything they might be missing.

School hats are available for purchase from the school office,. Due to a price increase from our supplier school hats will be \$20 each.

After School Care Options

I have had a couple of parents approach me about having other options in regards to after school care facilities rather than those that currently service Holy Family. In order to see if this is an issue affecting more families could you please send an email about this to the school office, addressing it Attention Mrs Fortini. If I get enough responses then I will have more evidence of this need to move forward with inquiries.

If you have difficulty in paying school fees or have not received your statement please contact Miss Ali to discuss the matter. Thank You


Payments can be made by cash or EFTPOS at the school office before 3.15 PM each day or via BPAY or at the Post Office.


