

INTO THE DEEP! New Religious Education Curriculum

The process of developing a new Learning Framework for Religious Education has been a co-creation with students, parents, teachers, clergy and system leaders. At the heart of the process was the commitment that the student wonderings about their faith would be the catalyst and the inspiration of the Learning Framework. The new approach is based on an experiential and inquiry based pedagogy and responds to learning elements of the Review of Religious Education that took place in 2014.

The draft Learning Framework for Religious Education was trialed in 2019 and our school took up the exciting opportunity to be a part of the trial in Kindergarten. All our teachers will participate in a Professional Learning Program for the new Learning Framework throughout 2020 and will be well prepared for its implementation. This is an exciting opportunity for our community to further enhance our approach to Religious Education and promises to offer great learning for our staff and students. We will undergo a process to develop new and exciting learning opportunities for all students within our school community.

We look forward to sharing this wonderful experience with you throughout the year through our Newsletter, Social Media, Liturgical Celebrations and by inviting Parents into the school to be a part of the learning.

2020 Religious Education Goal

All students will participate in meaningful *experiential opportunities* and lead *liturgical celebrations*, *co-planned with expert teachers*.

Experiential opportunities - Any activity that allows for children to have an experience of a particular concept/idea OR that allows for them to put into practice what they have learnt.

Liturgical celebrations - Any community celebration that has religious connections, for example a Mass at the Church or a Liturgy in our school grounds.


Co-planned - Students will play a part in the planning process. Students will make informed decisions about which songs to include, different prayers, etc.

Expert teachers - As a school community, we are always working for better outcomes for our students. One of the biggest ways we can achieve this is by developing the professional knowledge of our teachers. This includes their 'expert knowledge' about Liturgy and Church celebrations. Part of our professional learning agenda this year means teachers will be becoming experts in planning Liturgies.

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

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Attendance: The Silent blocker of learning Success



Over the years the school has informed parents about the need to ensure your child is at school every day unless sick. Regular school attendance encourages continuous learning and success both socially and academically.

The average CEDP attendance rate across other schools is 90%. This year I will monitor and advertise grade attendance rates. Although the school has made significant changes to improve the quality of teaching and learning and are working with students to improve individual learning, some students are away regularly which unravels the positive learning opportunities that are available to all students. **In short, interrupted learning reduces the opportunity to learn.**

Parents have full control over this. Parents need to ensure that your children are at school on time, everyday unless they are sick. With technology today, I can run reports on all students and identify patterns of absences for that student.

I encourage parents to please schedule holidays during school vacation times. A lengthy absence from school will disrupt the flow of learning. If you are experiencing difficulty getting your child to school, please contact the school for assistance. We are here to work as a team to encourage a positive mindset about school.

My question to you:

- ◆ What kind of message are you sending your child if you allow your child to stay at home for no other reason than they want to?
- ◆ What will this look like when they are in high school?
- ◆ How behind will they be compared to their friends as a result of high rates of school absences?

Parents you have the power to change this!





Learning Goals

Thank you to our Kindergarten and Year 1 parents for bringing your children in for their Best Start and MAI interviews. Students from Years 2 to 6 have been having their MAI interviews during class time. These interviews are one way for the teachers to understand your child as a learner. Over the next couple of weeks students and teachers will discuss and design learning goals for every child in the school, providing an individualised learning path for each student.

Parent Information Evening

All families are strongly encouraged to **save Tuesday 11th February** so that you are available to attend our Parent Information Evening. This year the staff and students are focusing on lifting the profile and valuing learning as an essential criteria for life. The mantra that you will hear throughout all learning spaces is **We are Learners.**

YES we are! Parents you are also part of this journey and we wish you to walk this journey each day in partnership with us. By attending the Parent Teacher Information evening is the first step in taking up this challenge, getting to know your child's teacher and being a role model to your child.

Band

Again in 2020 the Band program is being offered to Years 4, 5 and 6 students. The Band program is taught in class groups in these grades within their regular class timetable. The school has invested a lot of money to make sure that there are enough instruments available to the students in these three grades. The CEDP Captivate Team provides the school with specialist teachers and teaching resources for the delivery of this program. Individual and small group lessons in addition to the classroom program are also provided to enable students to continue their learning beyond the classroom.

Students in Year 5 and 6 take their instruments home so that they can practise the skills they have learnt in class. Children need only practice 10minutes per night and I encourage all parents to assist and remind their children to do this. The benefits will be remarkable. This is another avenue of learning for our children, something that many are not able to access outside of school.



Any students leaving in 2020 must give 10 weeks written notice, a form is available from the office.








Dear friends,

Re: Coronavirus

You will be aware through the media that this virus which originated in China is unfortunately gaining momentum and the World Health Organization has now declared a public health emergency.

As a result of this declaration and also advice from the NSW Department of Health, and after consulting Bishop Vincent the following directives apply in the celebration of Mass in the Diocese of Parramatta from 1 February 2020.


- In those parishes and communities in the Diocese of Parramatta where Holy Communion is distributed in Both Kinds, this practice will cease. Communion of the Precious Blood will be for the celebrant only.
- For the time being priests/deacons are not to invite parishioners to exchange the Greeting of Peace.
- All ministers of Holy Communion (both Ordinary and Extraordinary) are to use hand sanitisers before the distribution of Holy Communion commences.

These measures will be reviewed in due course and when advice is received that the threat of the virus has receded, and the emergency declaration is lifted, you will be advised accordingly, and the measures will be reversed.
