Year 6 Religious Education - Why me?

In Religious Education, to build confidence and understanding around leading our whole school community in praying the Angelus, Year 6 worked on deepening their knowledge of and made connections to Scripture (Luke 1:26-45) and the Angelus prayer.

The Angelus

The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary. R. And she conceived of the Holy Spirit. (Hail Mary ...) Behold the handmaid of the Lord. R. Be it done unto me according to thy word. (Hail Mary ...) And the Word was made flesh. R. And dwelt among us. (Hail Mary ...)

> Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: Pour forth, we beseech thee, O Lord, thy grace into our hearts; that, we to whom the incarnation of Christ, thy Son, was made known by the message of an angel, may by his passion and cross, be brought to the glory of his resurrection, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Students worked in their communication groups to highlight their noticings as well as defining the meaning of the words within the prayer.

As well, in our unit we will work together to answer our driving question Why me?

Year 6 looked at the life of Deng Thiak Adut, a Suddanese refugee and the challenges he has faced in his childhood and journey to becoming the first person in his family to graduate with a law degree. Also, throughout our unit we will be exploring ways in which we are invited to accept our Cross and walk with others.

Parent Information Night

Road Safety & Obeying Road Rules

On Friday the Cumberland Council sent out rangers to patrol the school and monitor parents parking habits and use of the Clyde St Pick Up Zone after complaints from residents. They did not book anyone but did take photos and have conversations with some parents.

It is imperative that all Holy Family parents and carers obey the road rules. Please do not park across private driveways, do not double park. When queuing up for Clyde St Pick Up drivers should leave at least 10m from the corner of Nobbs St.



Safety tips for drivers using a Drop-off and Pick-up zones

- Always drop off or pick up your child from the designated zone and follow the school's procedures.
- Drivers should remain in their vehicles at all times in the Drop-off and Pick-up zone.
- Make sure children use the Safety Door (the rear footpath side door) to get in and out of the car.
- Make sure the handbrake is applied when the vehicle is stationery.
- · Always park legally.
- Avoid dangerous manoeuvers such as U-turns and three-point turns.



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Safety tips for students

- Always get in and out of the vehicle through the Safety Door, the rear footpath side door.
- Stay buckled up until the vehicle has stopped in the Drop-off and Pick-up area.
- Make sure your school bag and other items are in a safe position, such as on the floor.
- Be ready to get out of the vehicle with your belongings when the car has stopped and you have unbuckled your seatbelt.

School Uniform



While CEDP target is set at 90% attendance the average for the diocese last week was 85% and Holy Family was at 84.8%. This is an improvement on the last fortnight and I hope it is an indication of positive growth in attendance for the year.

A huge congratulations to Kindergarten who had 95.5% attendance. This is a great start that I'm sure will continue as this cohort progresses through school.

To mark the ball you need to catch the ball without it bouncing on the ground. There are 3 types of mark's: Teddy Bear mark- (Catching the ball on your chest), Superman mark- (Catching the ball above the head) and Zombie mark- (Catching the ball in front of you).


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Premier's Reading Challenge 2020




