

Year 5 Religious Education

This term in Religious Education Year 5 has been learning to accept our Cross and walk with others. We have been doing so through an inquiry approach, investigating the concept of Sacrifice.

To launch our inquiry process we watched a video about a man named Deng Adut who was forced away from his family and made to fight as a child soldier. This really left an impression on us and allowed us to come to the realisation that a sacrifice can be one of two things:

1. A sacrifice might be something forced upon us

2. A sacrifice could also be something we may not want to do but it is the right thing to do, such as Jesus dying for our sins.

To reflect on what a sacrifice means we conducted a mini investigation and looked at six different scenarios about sacrifice and created some prayers of the faithful for the topics.

May the Lord Jesus be in everyone's hearts especially the ones who sacrifice things for what they believe in - Lord hear us.



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

Thank you to everyone who is working with us to increase our attendance rates. In the last fortnight we increased our percentage to 85.2% which was above the CEDP average but we are still below the targeted 90%. Congratulations to all the students in Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 4 who had averages of 95.4%, and 93% in Yr 1 & Yr 4. Imagine what our attendance averages would be if these numbers were replicated across the school.


