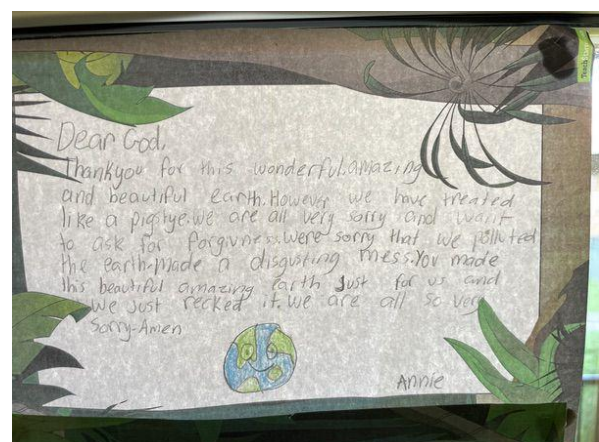
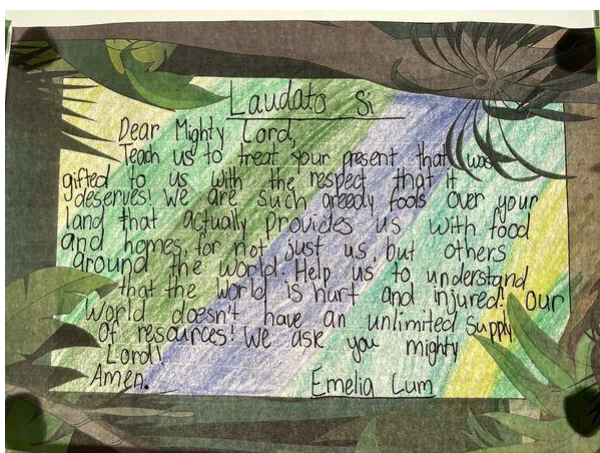
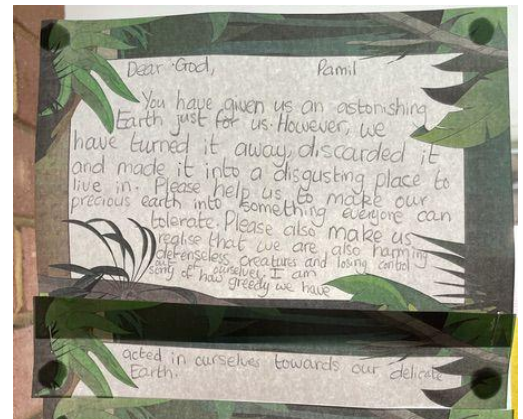


This term in Religious Education, Year 4 has been inquiring into the driving question: **How can we be custodians of creation?**

Students have identified that God's creation is not only the Earth, but everything that lives and grows within it. We as human beings are active participants in God's creation, that we are also co-creators with God. This means we are delegated with the responsibility to look after the Earth for future generations. We have learnt how to do this by being exposed to a range of texts such as The Lorax and The Giving Tree.

Recently, students have celebrated Laudato Si week. Laudato Si is an encyclical (letter) composed by Pope Francis informing people about the need to look after our Earth which we all share as a common home.

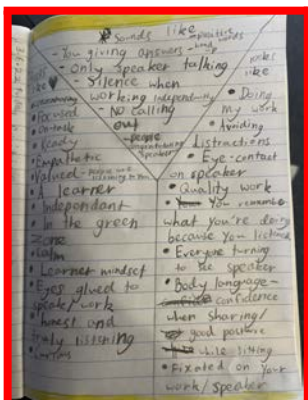

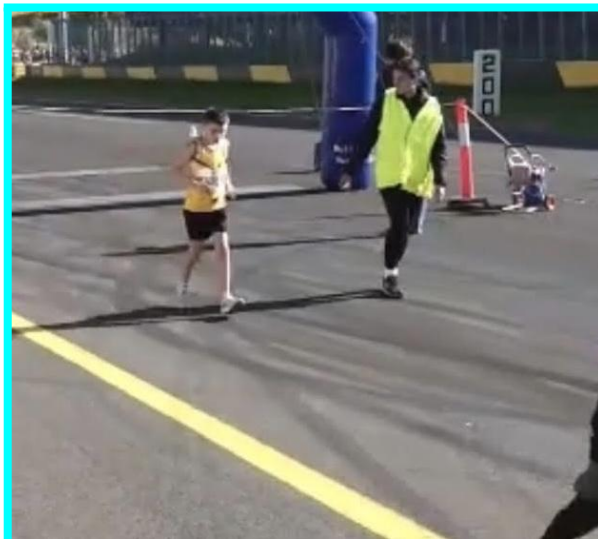
